Have your say about the Government's plans for Children's Social Care

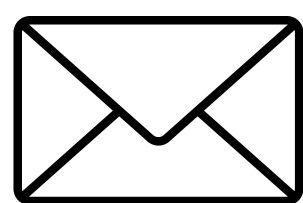

Everything discussed will feed into the work the Department for Education are doing to improve things for children and young people. Care experienced children and young people who are not part of local groups can also sign up and join the discussions.
