Why? The ANV AMPLIFY awards aim to champion and recognise the work of children in care councils and care leaver forums. They were held in October 2022 (<u>Amplify - Coram Voice</u>) – Wakefield children in care council were nominated for the 'Participation award'.

What did they do?

Wakefield children in care council (CiCC) is made up of different groups and ages (age 2 up to 32 last year). The CiCC created a video showcasing the work they have been doing over the last year.

- Influencing council policy (e.g. local offer for care leavers)
